# CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL MEMBER COMPANIES

Re: Workers Compensation Insurance

Revisions to NC Stat Plan Injury Description Table Codes

The North Carolina Rate Bureau has filed and the North Carolina Commissioner of Insurance has approved revisions to the North Carolina Workers Compensation Statistical Plan Manual (NC Stat Plan). The approved revisions include establishment of Nature of Injury Code 38 in the NC Stat Plan to add language for "Adverse reaction to a vaccination or inoculation" and revises Cause of Injury Code 82. Absorption, Ingestion or Inhalation, NOC to include vaccinations as proposed by the Workers Compensation Insurance Organization (WCIO). The approved changes will be applicable to all new and renewal voluntary and assigned risk policies in effect on or after effective December 1, 2020.

The revisions to NC Stat Plan Injury Description Table Codes revises the injury description table codes related to any adverse reaction to any vaccine. The approved changes are not limited to the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) vaccine and could be used for the flu vaccine or any other vaccination. A copy of exhibits outlining all NC Stat Plan changes are included for your review.

# North Carolina Rate Bureau Filing Memorandum Revisions to NC Stat Plan Injury Description Table Codes

# PURPOSE

The purpose of this filing is to revise rules related to:

• Injury Description Table Codes

This item revises rules in the:

### • North Carolina Workers Compensation Statistical Plan Manual (Stat Plan)

Exhibits showing revisions to the Stat Plan follow this filing memorandum. (See NCRB Exhibits 1-2)

## BACKGROUND

The World Health Organization categorized the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) outbreak as a pandemic when the rates of infection continued to rise in many locations around the world and across the United States. The President of the United States declared the COVID-19 outbreak a national emergency beginning March 1, 2020. The first COVID-19 (Coronavirus) vaccination in the United States was administered on December 4, 2020.

The International Association of Industrial Accident Boards and Commissions (IAIABC) requested that the WCIO Data Advisory Committee (DAC) consider adding Injury Description Table coding related to the adverse reactions to the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) vaccine. The WCIO DAC agreed that new code and wording be added to the current Injury Description Table to address any adverse reaction to any vaccine with an effective date of December 1, 2020. This proposed revision is not limited to just COVID-19 (Coronavirus) vaccine or any other vaccination. Please find pertinent excerpt from WCIO correspondence below.

#### Summary of Changes:

New Code: A new Nature of Injury Code will be added to address *ANY* adverse reaction to *ANY* vaccination. The committee did not want to limit this situation to COVID-19 vaccinations only. This code could also be used for flu vaccine also.

Nature of Injury	
38. Adverse reaction to a vaccination or inoculation	*

(Note that when we use an asterisk, it denotes that the description was intentionally left blank.)

New Guidance: Nature of Injury Code 38 should only be used with the following existing codes. The description for Code 82 has been expanded and is underlined below.

Cause of Injury	
82. Absorption, Ingestion or Inhalation, NOC	Not otherwise classified in any other code. Applies only to non-impact cases in which the injury resulted from inhalation, absorption (skin contact), ingestion of harmful substances, <u>or vaccinations.</u>
83. Pandemic	Includes disease epidemic that has spread across a large region.

# North Carolina Rate Bureau Filing Memorandum Revisions to NC Stat Plan Injury Description Table Codes

The NCRB recommends adoption of these revisions as the WCIO's research and analysis outlines.

Bureau staff has created exhibits showing how these changes impact the Stat Plan.

Changes to the rules for North Carolina are noted and explained in the summary that follows.

# PROPOSAL

This item proposes to:

- 1. Establish Nature of Injury Code 38 in the *Stat Plan* to add language for "Adverse reaction to a vaccination or inoculation"
- 2. Revise Cause of Injury Code 82. Absorption, Ingestion or Inhalation, NOC in the *Stat Plan* to include vaccinations.

The Bureau proposes the adoption of changes applicable to North Carolina being proposed as outlined in NCRB Exhibits 1-2.

## IMPACT

There is no premium impact for the proposed changes.

## **IMPLEMENTATION**

Rule revisions for North Carolina state-specific rules by way of the WCIO are applicable to all voluntary and assigned risk policies in effect on or after December 1, 2020.
